<b>Please outline the sampling and standardisation strategies you will use:</b>	<p>Work will be marked by a teacher in green pen. Once an assessment has been completed the teachers of that assessment will attend a standardisation meeting where three scripts will be assessed and standardised against the mark scheme. This session will be recorded for training purposes and staff attendance to this training will be recorded. Five pupils from each class will then be internally moderated in red pen to see if a second appropriate staff member agrees with the awarded grade. 5 pupils represents between 16% and 62% of each class depending on class size.</p> <p>A further 5 pupils will be selected by the school Senior Leadership team from a subject cohort. These scripts will be anonymised and internally moderated. This selection will have a representative sample of pupils with protected characteristics, particularly: eFSM pupils, EAL pupils, LAC, pupils, pupils from non-white ethnicities, young carers and those associated with the school Queer and Straight Alliance group.</p> <p>A clerical check will take place for every assessment sat to ensure that each page has been looked at and the grades recorded for the assessment are the same as the grades awarded.</p> <p>The department will follow the quality assurance checklist provided by the school:</p>

<b>Outline what steps will be taken if it is deemed necessary to adjust a teacher's assessments:</b>	The purpose of the moderation will be to check that the moderator can agree the rationale by which the original marker has awarded marks. If during a moderation process the moderator feels that they would award different grades they will report it to the director of standards. The director of standards will have the same scripts and a further five scripts sampled by a third party. Any changes that are made will be recorded. The teacher who has been the subject of scrutiny will review their marking for the assessment and make necessary changes to the remainder of their work.

The units covered for A2 Literature include Unit 5 coursework, Unit 3 and Unit 4.</p> <p>Any extenuating circumstances will be taken into account before the final grade is allocated.</p> <p>The final grade will be based on a judgement of evidence collected across units and assessment objectives, taking account of any adaptations made for 2021.</p> <p>All grades awarded will undergo stringent moderation procedures to ensure accuracy and consistency.</p>
