Please outline the sampling and standardisation strategies you will use:	Learner work will be marked by a teacher in green pen and during the standardisation meeting will be marked in red pen. Each member of the department will grade their Unit 2 recordings and will then choose 3 groups from the top, middle and bottom of their classes to bring to a moderation meeting. We will then as a Department moderate these recordings to ensure fairness and reliability with marking. We will then rank order learners within each grade category. This session will be recorded for training purposes and staff attendance to this training will be recorded. A further 5 pupils will be selected by the school Senior Leadership team from a subject cohort. These scripts will be anonymised and internally moderated and marked in purple pen. This selection will have a representative sample of pupils with protected characteristics, particularly: eFSM pupils, EAL pupils, LAC, pupils, pupils from non-white ethnicities, young carers and those associated with the school Queer and Straight Alliance group. A clerical check will then take place for every assessment sat to ensure that the grades recorded for the assessment are the same as the grades awarded.

Outline what steps will be taken if it is deemed necessary to adjust a teacher's assessments:	The purpose of the moderation will be to check that the moderator can agree the rationale by which the original marker has awarded marks. If during a moderation process the moderator feels that they would award different grades they will report it to the director of standards. The director of standards will have the same scripts and a further five scripts sampled by a third party. Any changes that are made will be recorded. The teacher who has been the subject of scrutiny will review their marking for the assessment and make necessary changes to the remainder of their work.
